BUILD Eco-Camp Samoa a springboard for our Samoa Based Projects! Building commencing November 2025.

Eco Camp Samoa is a grassroots initiative established on the lands of the **Fuataga Asini Aiga**, who have generously made their land available for the project. The camp will serve as a **central base for environmental action, intergenerational learning, and sustainable livelihood development** in Samoa.

At its heart, Eco Camp Samoa seeks to provide a place where local communities, volunteers, and international supporters can come together to restore ecosystems, strengthen cultural knowledge, and build pathways for sustainable social and economic development.

Rationale / Community Need

The Pacific faces pressing challenges—climate change, biodiversity loss, social disconnection, and the need for more sustainable livelihoods. Communities are seeking ways to:

- Protect fragile marine and terrestrial ecosystems
- Support young people to develop leadership, cultural, and environmental skills
- Build resilience through sustainable food systems and income generation
- Strengthen community cooperation and knowledge-sharing

Eco Camp Samoa responds to these needs by creating a **dedicated base for conservation**, **cultural exchange**, **and training**.

Vision and Objectives

Vision: A vibrant eco camp that empowers Samoan communities and international volunteers to protect the environment, strengthen cultural knowledge, and create sustainable livelihoods.

Objectives:

- 1. **Environmental Restoration** Support reforestation, reef planting, and biodiversity conservation.
- 2. **Cultural and Social Development** Create opportunities for intergenerational knowledge-sharing, cultural practice, and community celebration.
- 3. **Sustainable Livelihoods** Pilot projects in eco-tourism, organic farming, vanilla/cocoa cooperatives, and sustainable fishing.

- 4. **Education and Leadership** Host training programmes for young people in leadership, environmental science, and community development.
- 5. **Community Cooperation** Provide a shared space where families, villages, and partner organisations collaborate for positive change.

Proposed Activities

Eco Camp Samoa will be developed in stages. Initial activities include:

- **Camp Infrastructure:** Establishing eco-friendly facilities for accommodation, shared kitchen, water supply, sanitation, and training areas.
- **Volunteer and Community Programmes:** Hosting local and international volunteers to support conservation, farming, and cultural programmes.
- **Environmental Projects:** Planting trees, restoring reefs, and establishing organic food gardens.
- **Skills Development:** Training community members in eco-building, renewable energy, conservation techniques, and sustainable farming.
- **Cultural Programmes:** Workshops in indigenous knowledge, navigation, language, and traditional arts.
- **Income-Generating Ventures:** Developing small-scale enterprises (eco-tourism stays, handicrafts, produce, and cultural exchanges) to sustain the camp.

Outcomes and Impact

The Eco Camp will:

- Provide a permanent base for environmental and cultural programmes in Samoa.
- Strengthen community resilience against climate and economic challenges.
- Create pathways for **youth leadership** and skills development.
- Build international networks of solidarity through volunteerism and partnerships.
- Generate **sustainable income** through eco-tourism, produce sales, and cooperative enterprises.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Success will be measured through:

- Number of participants (local and international) engaged in camp activities.
- Hectares of land restored, number of reefs planted, and biodiversity indicators.
- Youth and community members trained in leadership, conservation, and livelihoods.
- Income generated through eco-camp enterprises.
- Community satisfaction and engagement feedback.

Governance and Management

The project will be led by members of the **Fuataga Asini Aiga** in partnership with community leaders, local organisations, and international supporters. A **steering committee** will oversee project delivery, ensure accountability, and guide development.

Sustainability

Eco Camp Samoa will be designed for long-term sustainability by:

- Building facilities with low-impact, locally sourced, and renewable materials.
- Developing renewable energy and water systems.
- Establishing income-generating activities to support ongoing costs.
- Embedding community ownership and leadership from the outset.
